
ASSEMBLIES



Writer's Corner

It Started With a Broken Microwave

One afternoon, I came home starving. I pulled some leftovers out of the fridge, tossed them into the microwave, hit a few buttons — and nothing happened. The screen blinked “ERROR.” My first instinct? Panic. My second? Search YouTube for a quick fix. But then I stopped and thought back to something I'd learned in school — not from a textbook or a lecture, but from a hands-on project where we had to solve problems step by step. That's when I realized something: competency-based learning had actually changed how I think. It hadn't just taught me facts and figures. It taught me how to use what I know in real situations.

In a traditional class, learning often feels like a race. You cover a topic quickly, take a test, and then move on to the next unit, whether you fully understand it or not. Sometimes things click, and sometimes they don't — but the clock keeps ticking. Competency-based learning is different. It focuses on making sure you truly understand a concept or master a skill before moving forward. That means you build real confidence. You're not just memorizing for a test — you're learning how to apply what you've learned in different contexts. That makes a big difference when you're faced with unexpected challenges, like a microwave that suddenly won't turn on.

I've used what I've learned from competency-based education in lots of real-life situations. For instance, during a group project at school, our team was having trouble getting along. Instead of ignoring the issue or letting it drag us down, I remembered the communication and collaboration strategies we practiced in class. I suggested we take a step back, listen to each other, and come up with a shared plan. It wasn't easy, but it worked. We finished the project successfully — and without the frustration we started with. Before learning this way, I probably would've just stayed quiet and hoped for the best.

Another benefit is time management. Since competency-based learning often lets you work at your own pace, I've had to learn how to set realistic

goals, break big tasks into smaller steps, and stay focused even when distractions pop up. Those skills don't just help me in school — they help me at home, too. Whether I'm doing chores, organizing a personal project, or even planning out my weekend, I've gotten better at thinking ahead and using my time wisely.

One of the most valuable lessons, though, is that mistakes are part of the process. If I mess up or don't get something right the first time, I don't feel like I've failed. I see it as a chance to try again — to rethink my approach, fix what went wrong, and learn from the experience. That's helped me in school, around the house, and even in how I deal with people.

Competency-based learning hasn't just helped me pass classes — it's helped me become a better thinker and a more capable person. It's helped me face problems with confidence, one step at a time.

प्रत्येक मनुष्य का रंग, रूप, वेश और भाषा भिन्न हैं इसलिए उनके अंक नहीं बल्कि उनके हुनर, उनकी योग्यता को पहचानना चाहिए। सच्ची योग्यता हृदय में है जिसका एहसास अंकों से परे है।

स्टीव जॉब्स जैसी महान हस्ती ने भी विश्व प्रसिद्धि अपनी योग्यता और रुचि के बलबूते पर हासिल की है। वे यह मानते थे कि समूची शिक्षा के द्वारा प्राप्त पुस्तकीय ज्ञान उनकी रचनात्मकता को बढ़ने नहीं देगा और यही कारण है कि उन्होंने कॉलेज पूरा नहीं किया ताकि वे तकनीक के क्षेत्र में यश कमा सकें।

सचिन तेंदुलकर दसवीं फेल होने के बावजूद आज कीर्तिमान स्थापित कर चुके हैं तो क्यों हम एक कक्षा में फेल होने पर ही विद्यार्थी का भविष्य निश्चित करते हैं। भारत की नई शिक्षा नीति भी छात्रों के ग्रेड की बजाय उनकी योग्यता एवं रुचि आधारित शिक्षा का समर्थन करती है।

एक बच्चा जो गणित में उत्कृष्ट है लेकिन दूसरों के साथ काम करने में सक्षम नहीं और नेतृत्व करना नहीं जानता, वह संगठन में अपना प्रभावी ढंग से योगदान नहीं दे सकता इसका अर्थ यह नहीं है कि उसमें कोई योग्यता नहीं है।

अतः हमें अंकों के पीछे दौड़ना छोड़कर अपनी असली ताकत और क्षमता तथा अपनी योग्यता को पहचानना और निखारना चाहिए।


