BOOK UNVEILING CEREMONY OF 'WINGS OF VALOUR' AT DELHI PUBLIC SCHOOL, JALANDHAR (13 OCTOBER'25)

WORLD MEDITATION DAY (21 DECEMBER'25)

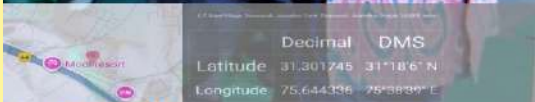
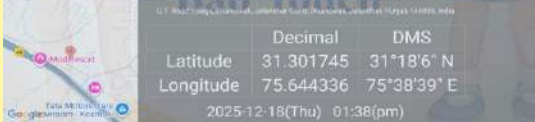
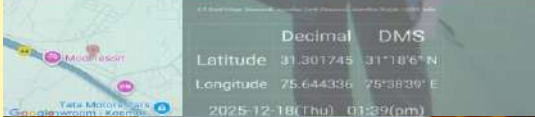
